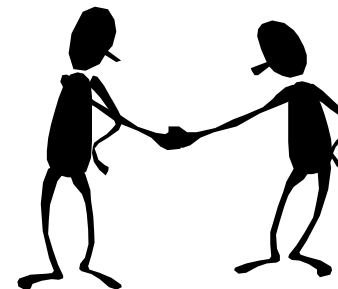

Who can help me?



▪ Your child's school

Speak to your child's Teacher or the school SENCo. They will be able to explain what strategies are being used in school and can refer your child to professionals within the Local Authority for further advice. Your child may have an Individual Education Plan. Share information with your child's school eg diagnosis or medication.

▪ Your GP or child's Consultant

If your child is taking medication for their ADHD and you have concerns about the effect of this on your child, speak to your Consultant.

▪ Your local Children's Centre

Your local Children's Centre will be able to provide information about local parent support groups and courses running in your area.
